Dozens convicted during administrative court sessions

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – The Mecklenburg County District Attorney's Office convicted dozens of defendants during administrative court sessions held in Superior Court between May 1, 2026 – May 29, 2026. The defendants entered their guilty pleas in courtroom 5310 before the Honorable Carla N. Archie, the Honorable W. Robert Bell, the Honorable William T. Stetzer, and the Honorable Louis A. Trosch Jr., Superior Court Judges.

Among those convicted were the following:

Ebonee Rahman, 45, pled guilty to second-degree murder. Judge Stetzer sentenced Rahman to 292-363 months in prison.

Jesus Garcia-Perez, 30, pled guilty to level III trafficking methamphetamine. Judge Archie sentenced him to 225-282 months in prison.

Jamotis Watkins, 20, pled guilty to 1) second-degree murder and 2) assault with a deadly weapon with intent to kill inflicting serious injury. Judge Stetzer sentenced Watkins to 192-243 months in prison.

Rebecca Oxendine, 43, pled guilty to second-degree murder. Judge Stetzer sentenced her to 165-210 months in prison.

Emanuel Parada, 22, pled guilty to second-degree murder. Judge Stetzer sentenced Parada to 157-201 months in prison.

Jacob Ramos-Arciniega, 18, pled guilty to second-degree murder. Judge Stetzer sentenced him to 157-201 months in prison.

Marquavis Spencer, 18, pled guilty to 1) second-degree murder and 2) assault with a deadly weapon with intent to kill inflicting serious injury. Judge Stetzer sentenced Spencer to 157-201 months in prison.

Reginald Anthony, 19, pled guilty to 1) second-degree murder and 2) conspiracy to commit robbery with a dangerous weapon. Judge Stetzer sentenced him to 157-201 months in prison.

Gregory Dowana, 30, pled guilty to voluntary manslaughter. Judge Stetzer sentenced him to 80-108 months in prison.

Lee Nelson, 30, pled guilty to 1) possession of a firearm by a convicted felon, 2) larceny of a motor vehicle, and 3) breaking or entering a motor vehicle. Nelson also admitted his status as a habitual felon. Judge Archie sentenced him to 101-134 months in prison.

Justin Eason, 36, pled guilty to 1) felony flee to elude arrest with a motor vehicle and 2) two counts of felony larceny. He also admitted his status as a habitual felon. Judge Archie sentenced Eason to 100-132 months in prison.

Conley Monroe Jr., 28, pled guilty to 1) assault with a deadly weapon and 2) possession of a firearm by a convicted felon. He also admitted his status as a habitual felon. Judge Trosch sentenced Monroe to 84-113 months in prison.

Tyzhaun Carney, 26, pled guilty to 1) involuntary manslaughter, 2) two counts of hit and run inflicting serious injury or death, 3) two counts of misdemeanor child abuse, and 4) driving while license revoked. Judge Stetzer sentenced Carney to 31-47 months in prison.

Leonardo Hernandez Perez, 32, pled guilty to involuntary manslaughter. Judge Stetzer sentenced him to 20-33 months in prison.

Jamal Sinclair, 24, pled guilty to possession of a firearm by a convicted felon. Judge Bell sentenced him to 14-26 months in prison.

Donnie Verdell Jr., 45, pled guilty to possession of a firearm by a convicted felon. Judge Bell sentenced him to 19-32 months in prison.

Alvin Edge, 47, pled guilty to possession of a firearm by a convicted felon. Judge Bell sentenced him to 20-33 months in prison.

Da'torious Ray, 25, pled guilty to level I trafficking in opioids by transportation. Judge Bell sentenced Ray to 70-93 months in prison.

Cristian Chacon-Membreno, 27, pled guilty to one count of attempted level I trafficking in cocaine by transportation. Judge Bell sentenced him to 10-21 months in prison.

Rico Myers, 21, pled guilty to habitual larceny. Judge Bell sentenced him to 8-19 months in prison.

Johonor Webb, 19, pled guilty to 1) possession of stolen goods and 2) assault by pointing a gun. Judge Bell sentenced Webb to 60 days in jail.

Zion Johnson, 17, pled guilty to robbery with a dangerous weapon. Judge Bell sentenced Johnson to 38-58 months in prison.

Preston Shipley, 33, pled guilty to 1) common law robbery and 2) intimidating a witness. Judge Bell sentenced Shipley to 17-30 months in prison.

Marques Addison, 27, pled guilty to 1) discharging a weapon into an occupied vehicle in operation and 2) discharging a weapon into an occupied dwelling. Judge Stetzer sentenced Addison to 67-93 months in prison.

Jaylin Johnson, 21, pled guilty to 1) two counts of discharging a weapon into an occupied dwelling and 2) conspiracy to discharge a weapon into an occupied dwelling. Judge Stetzer sentenced Johnson to 44-65 months in prison.

Keri Thompson, 58, pled guilty to attempted felony breaking or entering. Thompson also admitted his status as a habitual felon. Judge Archie sentenced him to 40-60 months in prison.

Christopher Mundy, 30, pled guilty to three counts of attempted trafficking in opium or heroin. Judge Archie sentenced Mundy to three consecutive sentences of 20-33 totaling 60-99 months in prison.

Sanchez Burris, 37, pled guilty to level I attempted trafficking in fentanyl by possession. Judge Archie sentenced Burris to 24-38 months in prison.

Ernest Council, 47, pled guilty to level I attempted trafficking in opium or heroin by possession. Judge Archie sentenced him to 17-30 months in prison.

Alexander Romero, 40, pled guilty to assault on a female. Judge Trosch sentenced Romero to 60 days in jail.

Alex Rebollo-Andino, 45, pled guilty to one count of possession of a firearm by a convicted felon. Judge Trosch sentenced him to 10-21 months in prison.

Rashiem Mooring, 34, pled guilty to assault inflicting serious bodily injury. Judge Trosch sentenced Mooring to 17-30 months in prison.

Terrell Hill, 37, pled guilty to felony flee to elude arrest with a motor vehicle. Judge Trosch sentenced Hill to 10-21 months in prison.
